Membership Terms & Conditions

1. Memberships are available to firms engaged in the production of aerospace, defense, and space systems, or support of these manufacturers as defined by the Board of Directors, provided the firm is not owned or substantially controlled, directly or indirectly, by a foreign government.
2. SEA will provide member services as defined in the SEA Membership Benefits Schedule. This schedule may be changed from time to time at the sole discretion of the SEA board of directors with written notice.
3. SEA membership operates on an anniversary basis from the date the member first joined. Members will pay fees annually by their anniversary date unless other arrangements have been made for payments with the SEA administrative office. SEA is interested in making it possible for everyone to join and will agree to any reasonable payment plan.
4. SEA will make its best efforts to identify funding sources to assist members in their lean manufacturing development efforts. SEA does not guarantee that funding sources will be available and, where funding is available, SEA accepts no responsibility for the funding program operation.
5. SEA has certified trainers and consultants in its Lean Enterprise System so that members can receive assistance in the conversion to the SEA Lean Enterprise System. The features of the SEA Lean Enterprise System are unique and have been designed to support an industry-wide conversion to lean practices designed to ensure competitiveness. SEA makes no representations or guarantees as to the fitness neither of the organization to receive services nor to the results that might be produced through such services. SEA results are largely a result of company leadership and therefore cannot be guaranteed in any way.
6. SEA contracts for project management and funding services with third parties called SEA Authorized Service Providers. SEA members are responsible for contracting with SEA Approved Service Providers directly. SEA members are encouraged to contract only with SEA Authorized Service Provider and make use only of certified consultants using SEA-approved materials. Consulting prices are not standard and may vary from state to state and by service provider.
7. Payment is due annually at the beginning of each membership year. Members may pay using an approved credit card or check – a discount will apply for prompt payment by check only if received within 15 days of invoice.
